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## Areti Damala

## Digital Humanities, Digital Heritage, Museum, Visitor & Gender Studies

Dr. Areti Damala is Senior Researcher at the Department of Collections and the Department of Museum Education of the Musée des Arts et Métiers (the French national museum of the history of science and technology), in Paris, France. She is also a member of the DICEN-IDF research laboratory. Her research interests lie at the cross-section of Digital Humanities, Digital Heritage, Experience Design, Museum, Visitor and Gender Studies. Initially trained as an archaeologist (University of Ioannina), she worked as a museum educator and as a digital media curator for the Cultural Centre of the City of Athens, the Hellenic Ministry of Culture, the History of Architecture Laboratory of the National Technical University in Athens, and the Medieval Studies Department of the University of Athens. She then obtained an MPhil in Information Systems and Cultural Heritage Management (University of Crete), working on an early version of the CIDOC model. Her PhD research focused on Mobile Augmented Reality as a mean for navigation, orientation, learning and meaning making in Cultural Heritage contexts, with an emphasis on museums and other informal learning environments. She carried out post-doctoral research in France and the UK, before getting appointed as a fixed-term Lecturer at the Digital Humanities Department of the University Paris 8 (Université Paris 8, Vincennes-Saint-Denis). Other supervising and teaching appointments were carried out at the University Paris 12 (Université Paris 12, Paris-Est Créteil) and the University Paris 1 (Université Paris 1, Panthéon-Sorbonne) in France, the Hellenic Open University in Greece, and the University of Strathclyde, in Glasgow, UK.

Member of the International Council of Museums since 2003, she is the coordinator of the Special Interest Group "Learning and Engaging Digitally", supported by the Cultural Education and Cultural Action Committee of the International Council of Museums (ICOM-CECA). Dr. Damala is also a member of the editorial board of the "Virtual Archaeology Review" of the Polytechnic University of Valencia and of the ACM JOCCH, Journal of Computing in Cultural Heritage. Member of the Greek Chapter of the ACM-W (ACM's Council on Women in Computing) and the associations "Femmes et Sciences" (France) and "Mothers in Science" (Belgium), she is also member of the Management Committee of the EU COST action "Voices: Making Young Researchers Voices Heard for Gender Equality" and a mentor for the Hellenic organisation "Women on Top".
